LETTER FROM THE MODERATOR OF LEHIGH PRESBYTERY

To the saints called by God to be Lehigh Presbytery:

It is with deep regret that I write to inform you that on Monday evening, June 15, 2015, the Session of the First Presbyterian Church, Bethlehem, PA (FPC-B) voted to enter the gracious dismissal process.

I commend the Session for not having taken this step rashly. You may recall that a year ago, FPC-B hosted an event featuring speakers from both the PCUSA and from ECO. In addition, there have been town halls and round tables with a gracious invitation always offered for Lehigh Presbytery to be present. These events culminated in a survey of the congregation conducted by TAG Consulting.

Much study has been done, but questions remain; and Lehigh Presbytery is committed to being a partner with FPC-B in seeking answers to these further questions.

Our Gracious Dismissal Policy states the following Value of Lehigh Presbytery (2. B. d): The goal of Lehigh Presbytery will always be reconciliation and continued engagement in relationship with all congregations within the Presbytery without the threat of isolation, estrangement or blame. Lehigh Presbytery is called to be a servant to the churches God has entrusted to it, encouraging and supporting them toward becoming healthy, growing, congregations. In doing so, Lehigh Presbytery hopes to creatively engage the concerns of the congregation, and enable them to make decisions based on facts and not assumptions, so that both the congregation and Lehigh Presbytery can concur that they have discerned God's will regarding continued denominational affiliation.

In the Providence of God, the lectionary points us this week to Mark 4:35-41 with Jesus asleep in the boat while the disciples confront the raging storm. Mark 4:39 (NRSV) [Jesus said] "Peace! Be still!" Then the wind ceased, and there was a dead calm.

Let us pray for the peace of Christ to surround and sustain our brothers and sisters in Bethlehem. May the work we do together in the time to come bring glory to our Lord Jesus Christ and peace to those for whom life in the PCUSA is akin to a storm tossed sea.

OUT OF CHAOS, HOPE

Since late March 2015, the United States has experienced several series of severe storms that has caused significant property damage and at least six deaths.

In late March, a large storm system tore through the Midwest, impacting the states of Arkansas, Illinois, Kansas, Missouri, Oklahoma, Tennessee and Texas. Hardest hit was Oklahoma where tornadoes hit the Oklahoma City and Tulsa areas.

In early April, severe storms again moved across the Midwest. Tornadoes, high winds and hail were reported in Illinois, Kansas and Missouri. Hardest hit were five Illinois counties – Boone, DeKalb, Lee, Ogle and Winnebago.

The end of April saw numerous storms, including 12 tornadoes, across the Midwest and Gulf Coast. Affected states include Alabama, Florida, Illinois, Kentucky, Louisiana, Missouri, Tennessee and Texas.

From April 30 through May 12, multiple large storm systems tore through eight states (in Arkansas, Colorado, Iowa, Kansas, Nebraska, Oklahoma, South Dakota and Texas) generating large hail, strong wind and several tornadoes that caused property damage, injuries and at least six deaths. Where tornadoes didn't hit, slow-moving storms brought torrential rainfall that flooded other areas, creating another life-threatening danger.

PDA Response

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) has reached out to all mid-councils in storm-affected areas to offer the care of the broader church and assistance as needed and requested.

Assistance from PDA may include financial funds from One Great Hour of Sharing and designated funds, and the presence of National Response Team (NRT) members to help

local Presbyterian leadership respond to the disaster within their community. Since March, 12 NRT members have gone on-site to help Presbyterian mid-councils.

Assistance from NRT members can include help with assessing damage, connecting to long-term response organizations, assessing the need for volunteer work teams and potential hosting sites, and offering spiritual and pastoral support and providing other assistance as needed.
